What an endless source of study and research would be necessary to enable one to understand such a simple little thing as a drop of water! Even what little is known about it is intensely interesting. A drop of water is inhabited. It has its flora and fauna. If reduced to a temperature of 32 degrees above zero it gains in bulk ten per cent and then solidifies or turns into ice. If reduced to eleven hundred degrees below zero it loses about 97 per cent of its bulk but the weight remains the same; at this temperature it becomes the hardest substance in nature. It would be about six times as hard as the finest steel, and with it your name could be scratched upon the purest diamond that was ever mined. Raise the temperature to 212 degrees and it turns into vapor; apply heat to the vapor until it is decomposed, then you have oxygen gas and hydrogen gas. Stick a match to either of these gases and they burn. Take the drop of water, put it on the fire thus created and it is extinguished.
