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STOCK BRANDS. Horse branded as above on left shoulder or left side. Cattle branded as above on left hip and upper clip on both sides.

FREE BRAND COLUMN. Horse brand on left side, cattle brand on left hip, marking in ear. P. O. Lawrence. Horse brand on ten on left shoulder; Cattle brand on left hip and upper clip on both sides.

J. P. Dickenson cattle brand J. P. on forehead on left hip. Horse brand on left side. P. O. Lawrence. Cattle brand figure ten on either hip; mark light crop off each ear, slip in each ear, and wattle on left jaw.

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
