Portland, Or., June 6.—The state election today resulted in a victory for the entire republican state ticket. T. T. Geor, republican candidate for governor, will have a plurality of at least 3000 and it may be larger.

At 11:30 o'clock Chairman G. A. Steel of the republican state central committee gave out the following: The republicans have carried the state by at least 5000 majority.
