There is no imminent danger of the invasion of Lake county by diseased cattle which are being driven north from Southern California. The stockmen of Modoc and Lassen counties, California, have organized to prevent the cattle from passing through or stopping on their ranges. Modoc is the California county which borders on Lake county, Oregon, and Lassen is south of Modoc. The vigilance of the Modoc and Lassen stockmen renders Lake county comparatively safe, but the infected cattle should be watched lest they be driven eastward through Plumas county, California, thence through Nevada and upon the valuable ranges of Grant, Harney and Malheur counties, in Oregon. The presence of these diseased cattle in Oregon would be a double menace to our stock interests. They are infected with Texas fever and tick, and besides would cut our ranges clean. We want no disease and we need all the feed there is for our own cattle. Governor Lord's proclamation is a timely and meritorious state paper.—Oregonian.

The Spanish press is equal to the situation in keeping up the courage of their people by publishing accounts of domestic troubles in our great republic. Only three weeks ago the El Tiempo, a Madrid Journal, regaled its readers with the following bit of choice news:

"Word has just been received here that the Indians are rising against the Yankees in Illinois, Ohio and other places. The farmers are petitioning the government to protect them from the bloodthirsty savages, who are burning houses and killing on every side. Troops are asked for at Colorado, in the state of Denver, and at St. Louis (San Luis), in Missipi."

"News is brought to us that Buffalo Bill, a notorious outlaw and leader of a band of half-breeds has risen against the American government, and is burning towns near his birthplace in New York." The "yellow" journalism of our beloved country should report some of those Spanish writers. The opportunities of the past are lost, but the future should give bright promises to any paper that could secure a full staff of writers like the one that furnished the Madrid journal its blood-curdling news.—Exchange.

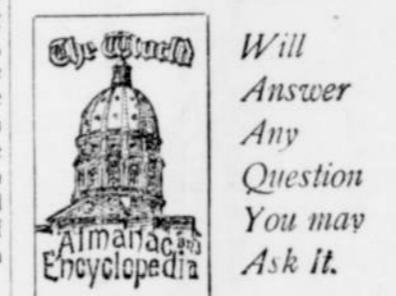

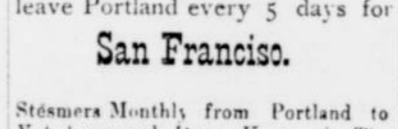

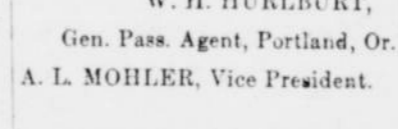
