He gave a name different from that of the girl, and the children were both under the same roof for a couple of months before it was found that they were brother and sister. It appeared that the father of these children, who was said to have been a heavy drinker, died some years before, and the mother had married a man then residing in Vavcouver, from whom she was subsequently
