The Election.

The election returns indicate that the next senate will stand 59 republicans to 40 opposite. The house will probably contain 185 republicans, opposition 172.

A summary of the returns is as follows:
California—Gage, republican elected governor. Democrats elect 2 supreme judges, secretary of state and 2 congressmen.
Missouri—Democrats elect 42 congressmen, republicans 3.
Massachusetts—Republicans elect governor. Thayer, democrat, elected to congress third district.
Connecticut—Republican state and congressional ticket elected.
Arizona—Democratic congressional delegation.
Colorado—Entire fusion ticket elected.
Delaware—Republican congressmen.
Idaho—Democrats elect state ticket and a congressman.
Indiana—Democrats lose the state but elect 5 congressmen.
Iowa—Republicans made a clean sweep.
Kansas—Republican state ticket is elected and 7 of 8 congressmen are republicans.
Kentucky—Democrats elect 10 of 11 congressmen.
Minnesota—Democratic governor and republicans elect entire congressional ticket.
Montana—Democrats one congressman.
New Mexico—Republican congressman elected.
Nebraska—The fusion forces have carried the state.
North Dakota—The republicans are assured a congressman and most of the state ticket.
Nevada—Governor republican silver republican elected to congress.
Pennsylvania—Republican governor, democrats gained 6 congressmen.
New York—Republican governor, democrats elect 19 congressmen.
Ohio—Congressional delegation stands 15 republicans 6 democrats.
Texas—A democratic sweep. One republican congressman pulls through.

Utah—Democrats carried state and congressional tickets.

Washington—Republicans elect 2 congressmen and the legislature.
West Virginia—Each party secures 2 congressmen.
Wyoming—Republican state and congressional ticket successful.

Illinois—Democrats have gained 6 congressmen.
Maryland—Four republican and two democratic congressmen elected.
Alabama—Democrats victorious with a solid delegation.
Florida—Entire democratic ticket elected.
Louisiana—The democrats made a clean sweep.
Michigan—Pingree, republican elected governor, vote on congressmen close in 6 of the 12 districts, result not yet known.
New Jersey—Republicans elect state ticket. Democrats get 2 of 8 congressmen.
North Carolina—Democrats elect all but 2 congressmen.
Tennessee—The democrats get everything but 2 congressmen.
New Hampshire—Two republican congressmen.
South Carolina—Entire democratic ticket elected.
Georgia—All the democratic candidates are elected.
Arkansas—Solid democratic delegation.
Rhode Island—Republicans elect both congressional candidates.
Virginia—Solid democratic delegation.
South Dakota—Almost certain republicans are elected.

Circuit Court

The following are the proceedings of the circuit court since last report:
CRIMINAL.
State of Oregon vs Fred Haines, larceny by bailer; jury brought in a verdict of not guilty; debt discharged; sureties exonerated.
State of Oregon vs Fred Haines, selling liquor without a license; debt arraigned; copy furnished; dem to indictment filed; overruled; submitted to court on written stipulation of facts.
State of Oregon vs J. C. Buckland, selling liquor without a license; debt arraigned; copy furnished.

LAW.
J. Durkheimer vs Henry Bugler, account; settled and dismissed.
L. Woldenberg vs Fred Haines, writ of review; writ sustained; cause remanded back to justice court of Harney district with instructions to send case to Burns district for trial.
Burns justice to overrule motion for change of venue.
Pacific Live Stock Co vs Oar Bros; settled and dismissed.

Robt Irving treasurer of Harney, vs Fred Haines; Nov. 2 debt declines to plead further; judgment for plaintiff for \$701.45, no interest, and costs; attachment abandoned; motion to dissolve attachment allowed.
R. A. Miller & Co vs John Crabb; personal service; default and judgment; order for sale of attached property.
J. L. Sitz vs J. P. Dickenson; dem to complaint; overruled.

EQUITY.
In the matter of the assignment of Ira G. Boyce, an insolvent debtor, vs Fred Haines, assignee; final report of assignee accepted and approved; sureties exonerated.
Anna W. Sayer vs Knapp Barrell & Co and A. Gittings; continued on former order.
D. N. Varian vs E. C. Taylor; injunction; in hands of referee; continued on former order.
C. W. Stevens vs A. A. Cowing; recovery of money; order made for clerk to pay to W. J. Coleman \$69.30 amount due from plaintiff to stenographer now in clerk's hands; continued on former order.
D. Finnamore vs J. S. Varian; injunction; dem to complaint; argued; overruled; answer filed.
J. R. Hendricks vs Malheur and Harney Lake Irrigation Co; same as above.

Thanksgiving proclamation.
"Executive department, Salem, Or. Nov. 7, 1898.—"In recognition of the many blessings vouchsafed to our people by the Giver of all good. I, William P. Lord, governor of Oregon, in accordance with an established usage, do hereby designate Thursday, the 24th day of November, 1898, to be observed as a day of Thanksgiving.
"On that day, I recommend, that all people abstain from all secular employment, and devote it to religious observance, to charitable acts and sympathy with the sorrowing, to the pleasure of hospitality and social recreation, to the cultivation of patriotic sentiments and profound respect for law and order, and to the remembrance of our brave soldiers, living or dead, who upheld the honor of our flag and maintained the prestige of American arms.
"Witness my hand and the seal of the state of Oregon, at the capitol, in Salem, this Seventh day of November, A. D. 1898.
