Brooke Appoints Officers.

Havana, Jan. 19.—General Brooke has appointed Tomas Vicias to be secretary of the supreme court. He also appointed three judges for the province of Pinar del Rio. Notwithstanding the unpopularity of the bank and the attacks upon the act which allows it to collect back and present taxes, the sum of \$400,000 was deposited in that institution yesterday, largely by Spaniards. It is said that such deposits will increase because of the knowledge of the bank's funds cannot be manipulated by the Spanish government.

The citizens of Puerto Principe propose to elect a committee of local men to advise with General Carpenter regarding the government of the province. The committee will request the discharge of Spanish members of the municipal government who are still in office.

The American board of pardons yesterday recommended the release from jail of seven men who have been confined without trial since 1898, for the alleged robbery from a safe of funds belonging to the navy paymaster for San Juan de Puerto Rico. The prisoners declare, and information from San Juan tends to sustain them, that the alleged robbery was a plot upon the part of Spanish officials to cover up their delinquencies and to obtain escape-funds for the Spanish paymaster at San Juan, who, it is further asserted, was probably a party to the dishonesty in appropriating the funds.

The board of pardons has examined many other prisoners, and has recommended to General Brooke the release of 67 who are in confinement.

To Persuade Uncle Sam To Relinquish Philippines.

St. Louis, Jan. 20.—J. Lasoda, M. Marti Burgos and J. Luna, commissioned representatives of Aguinaldo, the insurgent leader of the Philippine islands, passed 20 minutes in St. Louis today en route to Washington. Their mission is to persuade Uncle Sam to relinquish his hold on the Philippine islands. Senor Marti Burgos said: "We

reached San Francisco December 24 and have since been studying sentiment in the United States on the Philippine question. From hundreds of leading Americans with whom we have conversed we find the vast majority are opposed to annexation of the islands to this country. For 377 years we have been under the yoke of Spanish tyranny. Give us liberty and 'progress' will be the watchword of our citizens."

Regarding Iloilo Senor Burgos declared Aguinaldo would think well before allowing the Americans to take it. "It is a big country," he said, "and a prize that we captured through our own efforts." When asked if there would be a specific plan mentioned for disposing of the Philippines to the natives, Senor Burgos said: "No, I think not, but we have a proposition under consideration which I cannot make public at this time. We will meet our ambassador, Agoncillo, in Washington and consult him before seeing the president."
