From what the witness could learn, the accident happened in the following manner: Mr. Oard's work horses were running loose in the corral. They caught and rode one another the corral without any trouble, but then attempted to ride the assistant the corral and away from the other horses the horse refused to go and when urged began to jump when the saddle turned and threw the boy, his hat catching in the straggles with the above stated result. The family, which is a distant relative of Mr. Oard of Back creek, also of Oard's name, was notified and arrived from Olin, and have been staying with and working for Mr. Oard of Back creek. The family consisted of father and mother and four boys the eldest of which was killed. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. A. J. Train (A. J.) were held from the church at Harney Tuesday at 10 o'clock. The body was interred in the Harney cemetery.
