The results of the elections last Tuesday was not a surprise in any instance unless it be that of New York City where the Tammany democrats who have controlled the city government for practically 17 years were turned down. It would seem from the number of fruit tree and berry bushes delivered here last Monday, that in a very few seasons we will be shipping out fruit instead of paying ranchers of the John Day and Snake River valleys fancy prices to bring it in. If our ranchers will only be careful in planting their trees and take special care of them for the first season or two, the problem of fruit raising in Harney county is solved. Too much care cannot be taken with young trees at least the first season.

#### LAW.

James Donegan vs Paul Locher, recovery of money; continued and set for trial second day of next regular term.

The Citizens Bank vs Frank C. Fister recovery of money; default and judgment by consent \$1500.00 and interest and \$80 allowed as attorney fees and order sale of attached property.

J. J. Topkar vs Geo. Stanclift, recovery of money; default and judgment \$5 allowed as attorneys fees.

The Citizens Bank vs M. H. Brenton, default and judgement \$9 allowed as attorneys fees. Order for sale of attached property.

#### EQUITY.

W. D. Huffman vs Fanny Huffman, divorce; decree in favor of defendant.

H. Hotchkiss vs G. W. Young, injunction. Decree in favor of defendant.

W. D. Hanley vs Charles Nelson, trespass; referred to J. W. Coleman to report testimony by the next term of court.

Frances Brenton vs H. M. Brenton, divorce; referred to W. J. Coleman to report testimony.

Ellie May Syme vs H. B. Syme divorce; decree of divorce.

School district No. 2 vs James Pirie; referred to J. W. Coleman to take testimony of witnesses in this county, and Austin Craig, of Whitney as special referee to take testimony of H. F. Dodson and R. M. Haley special referee to take testimony of witnesses in Canyon City.

H. M. Horton vs Etta Hutton, divorce; referred to J. W. Coleman to report testimony.

J. W. Geary vs Josephine Geary, divorce; default of defendant entered. Decree as prayed for.

Matilda Racine vs Frances Brenton, foreclosure of mortgage; Decree by consent.

The Citizens Bank vs F. C. Fister and J. H. Neal, foreclosure of mortgage; A. Venator appointed receiver by consent. Answer of deft F. C. Fister withdrawn by consent. Decree as to Fister to pay a verdict of \$2071.60 and interest. \$207 allowed for attorneys fees.

L. Woldenberg vs Christopher Berg, suit for dissolution of partnership and an accounting; referred to W. J. Coleman to report testimony.

Alice Z Hoover vs Newt Hoover; decree as per mandate of supreme court.

#### CRIMINAL.

City of Burns vs Paul Locher, selling liquor without license; verdict of guilty. Sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 and costs.

State of Oregon vs Mathew Price, larceny; jury returned verdict of guilty. Sentenced for one year in the penitentiary.

State of Oregon vs D. H. Smyth, assault with a dangerous weapon, jury returned a verdict of not guilty. Decree discharged.

Court adjourned Thursday evening.

### Citizens Business College Opened.

From the encouraging appearances of last Monday evening the Citizens Business College of Burns will be one of the permanent institutions of Eastern Oregon. On that evening a large crowd filled the neat and comfortable quarters fitted

up for the College to witness the opening exercises. The program consisted of addresses by Hon L. S. Geer, Rev Father McDevitt, Prof A. C. Finn of the public schools, Rev G. W. Black and Prof Rigby. This was interspersed by some excellent music by the band and singing by the choir.

Mr. Geer discussed the benefits of the College from a stand point of a business man. Rev. Father McDevitt, in his usual happy strain, gave a short talk on the benefits and possibilities of such an institution in this section, where young men and women could fit themselves for future work. Prof Finn discussed the different branches taught, as outlined on the black board. Rev. Black with a few chosen remarks wished the institution success and spoke a good word for the principal, with whom he had been acquainted for a number of years. Prof. Rigby closed the program with a few happy remarks in which he expressed his appreciation of the encouragement given by the citizens and business men of Burns and vicinity. He also gave an outline of the course of study.

The Citizens Business College of Burns starts off with very flattering prospects, having a goodly number of students enrolled with others to enter in the near future. The management is well pleased with the opening. Our people all seem interested with the College and will do what they can to help it along. They realize the benefit of such an institution of learning in this country.
