## NO POLITICS IN THE FAIR.

PORTLAND, Or., May 22, 1902.  
EDITOR HERALD: A number of persons have called upon me in reference to the Lewis and Clarke Centennial and American Pacific Exposition and Oriental Fair, and have asked me to designate who of the various candidates for certain positions, in my judgment, would best subserve the interests of the fair, if they should be elected to the respective positions. I have in all instances informed the gentlemen that I, being chairman of the state commission and also chairman of the organization in Portland for the successful promotion of this enterprise, have declined in every instance to express any preference for any candidate for these respective positions, and have always informed the gentlemen that we wanted the help of every class of citizens, democrats, republicans and every other shade of politics to net and co-operate with us in promoting the success of the fair.

The request from the board of directors, to those who have been selected to visit the various towns and cities in the state, was that they should avoid, in every way, any indications of political preference for any candidate where meeting to create an interest and aid and co-operation for the Lewis and Clarke Centennial. The board of directors would regard it as very unfortunate if politics should enter into this laudable enterprise. It is the desire of the directors to avoid in every way any political significance of this event. It is wholly with a view of honoring President Jefferson and Lewis and Clarke, who conceived the idea of an expedition to the Pacific Coast for the purpose of more firmly establishing our rights to the great Northwest, called the Oregon country, that the people might inherit and enjoy its vast region irrespective of political predilections, and certainly in commemorating this one hundredth anniversary we should not by any act of ours allow our political preferences to enter into the consideration of this great event.

I, therefore, desire to say, as chairman of the organization for the promotion of the fair, that we wish to declare that this enterprise in no way will be used to influence the votes for any particular candidate for any position for which he may be nominated by either party. I make this statement as I have had frequent calls to know whether this fair was to be a republican partisan fair or otherwise. I have always declared that there was no politics in the matter and that we expected the support of both parties, who have both endorsed the fair, and I understand whoever is elected will give their hearty and united support for this non-partisan enterprise. We expect whoever is elected to the legislature, whether democrat or republican, whoever is elected mayor of the city, whether democrat or republican, whoever is elected governor, whether democrat or republican, will give their hearty support and co-operation, otherwise it would be futile for us to attempt to hold an exposition of this great event.

We expect that when the matter of an appropriation comes before congress, that we shall have the co-operation of the senators and representatives from the democratic state of Missouri in the same cordial manner as extended by our representatives on the Pacific Coast to them for the Louisiana Purchase Exposition.

## DEMOCRATIC PROSPECTS BRIGHTEN.

Encouraging reports are pouring into the democratic headquarters at Portland from all sections of the state. The tidal wave of enthusiasm that arose at the time the state convention was held has swept on with increasing force ever since. All voices are of a character to indicate a democratic victory on the 2d of June for George E. Chamberlain, the party's gallant leader, and his associates on the state ticket.

It is the most remarkable movement in the history of politics in Oregon. In the affairs of the republican campaign there exists chaos and disorder to a dangerous extent. C. W. Fulton, of Astoria, co-operating with Mr. Furnish and Mr. Williamson, apparently was given to understand that he was to be the state candidate for the United States senate. At a republican rally in Portland on the evening of May 19th, Chairman Lewis announced Mr. Fulton as the next United States senator. Walter Lyon, private secretary of Governor Geer, called upon Chairman Jack Matthews of the republican state central committee and wanted to know if this announcement was official. The result of their interview was that Chairman Matthews declared that Multnomah county would never support Mr. Fulton for the senate. This, and other incidents, have caused such a storm of disagreement and quarreling at the republican state central committee's headquarters as to sow the seeds of defeat.
