A most vigorous protest is being made by citizens of this section against the proposed forest reserve north of this valley. We have heard almost all our leading business men express their disapproval of this scheme as it will be a great drawback to the development of this country. It would also seriously interfere with the building of a railroad into this section, as the timber is one of the main inducements, Stockmen claim that the reservation of 6000 square miles of territory would interfere very materially with summer range and that such a move is little better than range leasing. The impression is that it is not being reserved for the purpose of preserving the timber nor will it be of any great benefit to the irrigation schemes now under way in this valley. We are led to believe that the matter has been promoted for the purpose of speculators in lieu land scrip. It is made very plausible as being for the purpose of protecting the water sheds of various streams will it be a benefit in this direction is the question. Prominent men in this section advocate protests July, 1902. in the form of petitions to be sent to the department setting forth the facts as they exist and showing that the proposed reserve will - be a great detriment instead of a benefit. According to the map of will include much valuable landagricultural, and grazing as well 1901 as timber-in the northern part of Harney county, much of which has been settled and is now in use as stock ranches, farming, etc. If anything is to be done in the way of a protest, it should be done

Reports still come to this office of the destruction of crops by rabbits, but as yet no petitions, other than the one spoken of heretofore in these columns, asking the county court to place a bounty on them has been received. If the ranchers desire a bounty they should petition the court. We think, however, that some methodmay be devised by which the pests may be greatly reduced in numbers without a bounty. Drives have been suggested and it is possible the county board would assist very materially in arranging for such by standing the expense of corrals and wings. We are not authorized to make such a statement as the above, but know that all are interested in the destruction of the rabbits and feel that the court will stand any reasonable amount as an experiment.

The rapid settlement of timber land of the past few days may be of great benefit to this section in that it will call attention of transportation companies and lumber concerns of capital. So many claims being located in one body in a fine belt of timber will be an inducement to railroads to tap,
