The Times-Herald regrets that there were not more and larger displays of grain, fruit and garden produce exhibited at the fair the past week. It is not doing justice to our county to allow such occasions to go by with so little interest shown by our farmers. While the exhibits were good, there should have been more competition and a larger amount shown. The stock exhibit was also a disappointment. Harney county has some of the best stock on earth, yet but few could be seen on the fair grounds and in the stables. People should remember that the association has no aid from the state in paying premiums on exhibits and that each premium is as good as circumstances will permit. It is to the mutual benefit of all to make the county fair as much of a success as possible.

The Baker City Morning Democrat, of Sept 23, contains a nice write-up of Burns from the pen of its field correspondent, J. W. Elsworth. He ends a two column article with the following:

Burns has a remarkable large number of fine residences, these home buildings being often made doubly attractive by the fine fencing, emerald lawns, gardens, shade trees and so on. Water is in many cases secured by windmills or by pumping to tanks by small gasoline engines.

The vast territory for which Burns is the chief trading, banking and commercial point will not long hence be tapped by at least one railroad. This will make the city an increasingly important distributing point, largely ending the regime of prairie schooners which require from two to three weeks to make the round trip to the railroad at Huntington or Ontario, the distance being 150 miles and the freight rates varying according to the season from \$25 to \$50 per ton.

Ontario a growing town.

A representative of The Times-Herald spent one day last week in the thriving little city of Ontario, the growing metropolis of Malheur county. Ontario has become quite an important shipping point for Harney county livestock and wool besides drawing a large amount of trade from this interior section. Her business men are energetic and wide awake to her interests.

While there over 840 head of Harney county horses were brought in for shipment and enroute near were over 600 head of beef cattle and still another 1000 head were encamped at Rock creek that were leaving Harney county for this point where they were to be loaded and shipped to points East.

The various business concerns of that place offer good inducements to those who desire to go to the railroad for supplies and are using printer's ink quite generously as will be seen in these columns. The competition gives the purchaser a great advantage. The large stock carried by the different concerns enables one to make good selections.

The Malheur Mercantile Co. has just completed a large annex to its store building with a basement in order to make room for its growing trade. The O. F. Co. is selling its immense stock for cash and offers great bargains. Boyer Bros. are also well provided to fill big orders and are asking the people of Harney county to give them a chance to quote prices. 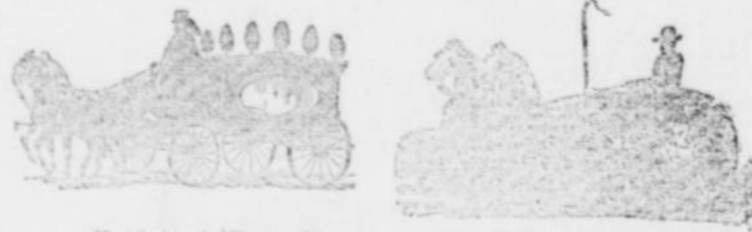
