The Times-Herald has been asked to print a number of petition or protests similar to those circulated in Grant county against proposed forest reserve, to be sent to the various precincts in this county. These petitions will be accompanied by a letter signed by all the business men of Burns in which they express themselves as apposed to the measure. We are glad to see action taken along this line and will print the protests immediately.

A number of our residents are becoming tired of being annoyed by drunken Indians and some one is going to get into trouble if selling or giving liquor to them is not stopped. It is a disgrace to the community to see the drunken worthless vags lying around. The fact that we have no city jail has caused the "noble Reds" to become very bold and insulting and it is getting so men cannot leave their homes of an evening as they do not hesitate to frighten the women when they find the men are away. People should have more respect for themselves and community than to be giving these Indians liquor. Citizens living on the hill are constantly annoyed by them, lying around the yards at night and keeping up a "pow wow", threatening to burn houses and fighting among themselves. Not much of this is seen on main street for the marshal drives them off, but instead of going to camp they stop at residences and harass defenseless women and children. If things do not improve, an investigation will be made and find who is to blame.
