### FORESTER FAVORS THE RESERVE.

A dispatch from Baker City to the Oregonian, says: George B. Sudworth, assistant forester of the Bureau of Forestry of the United States Department of Agriculture, accompanied by A. J. Johnson, forestry expert for Oregon, has arrived in this city, after a six week tour of inspection of the Blue Mountain forest reserve, contemplated in the recent temporary executive order withdrawing the greater portion of the timber lands of Eastern Oregon from entry or sale. Mr. Sudworth says that the object of the government in establishing the proposed reserve is to protect the settlers, and especially the mining industry, in the years to come. His examination of the country covered by the proposed reserve has convinced him of the wisdom of making the temporary order permanent, and he will so report. He stated that the regulations of the government would prevent the shipping of lumber manufactured from reserve timber out of the state, but that there would be no restrictions put upon the cutting of timber for home consumption. From the survey made by Mr. Sudworth he is decidedly of the opinion that the limited supply of timber in Eastern Oregon demands that the government shall protect the future development of the country by conserving the timber and holding it for the benefit of local industries, such as farming, railroad-building, mining, home manufactures, etc. In the opinion of Mr. Sudworth, unless some restriction is put upon the destruction of timber in this part of Oregon, within a few years mining and agricultural pursuits will be greatly crippled for want of timber.

(It is to be observed that Forester Sudworth is connected with the Department of Agriculture, while the public lands and forest reserves fall under the jurisdiction of the Department of the Interior.)
