BOARD OF TRADE ORGANIZED.

Electric Railroad from Baker City now Under Consideration.

At a meeting of the business men held at the court house Thursday afternoon a Board of Trade was organized with Hon. L. S. Geer as president, N. U. Carpenter, vice-president, F. S. Rieder, Secretary, Sam Mothershead, asst. secretary, H. M. Horton, treasurer, J. C. Welcome, Dr. L. E. Hubbard and Ben Brown, directors or executive board.

The meeting was brought about by Mr. Carpenter of the First National Bank, who has been in communication with the Sumpter Valley Railroad people and Major J. W. Bonta relative to transportation facilities for Harney county.

J. W. Bonta, who has organized and financed a corporation to build an electric standard gauge road from Baker City south is now on the grounds at work and anxious to meet our people on the proposition of extending his line to Burns as soon as possible.

Our engineer corps or surveyors will take the field tomorrow, surveying our railroad route from here to Prairie City. I should like to be in communication with your parties relative to extending our line over to Burns.

Later a lengthy communication from Major Bonta giving in detail the organization of his company, its objects capitalization and privileges was received.

The proposition of the railroad people is one of the most reasonable ever offered by such a concern. They ask for no bonus, but desire the people of this section take bonds for which stock in the company will be given of equal value of the bonds.

Representatives will be sent either to Prairie City or Baker City to confer with Major Bonta and find as to the amount of bonds would be expected to justify the extension of the road to Burns.

After reading the letters referred to above a general discussion followed as to the best plan of treating with the proposition. It was then decided to effect a permanent organization with the result above stated.

The selection of representatives to meet Major Bonta was left to the officers of the board. The meeting adjourned to meet again on Friday evening, May 15 at 7:30 o'clock at the court house, when the committee on by-laws and membership will report.

The Times-Herald congratulates the Business men of Burns upon effecting such an organization which will be permanent. Not only will such propositions as the railroad question now under consideration be brought before such a body, but many things that are of special importance to the business interests of Burns and Harney county will be taken

up. Such an organization has long been needed. It is the duty of every citizen of this city and community to give support to the new organization and assist in whatever way possible.
