\$525 FOR THE HEPPNER SUFFERERS.

Harney county responded quite liberally to the aid of the flood sufferers at Heppner. The first of the week some of our citizens interested themselves in the matter and without a popular subscription or individual contributions raised \$525 which was forwarded to the stricken city.

BIG LAND FRAUD.

Chief Hydrographer Newell who recently returned to Washington from a visit to the West, says: "I was very much disheartened while in the West to find that asso-

ciations for a consideration ranging from \$50 to \$100 are advertising, by circulars and otherwise, to direct homeseekers to vacant public land, which they allege is to be reclaimed by the National Government. These associations make the showing that they are forced to represent homeseekers, and propose to give them inside information. They have no inside information. They do not know what lands the government intends to irrigate, for no one knows, not even the department. They are simply defrauding the people.

"They are sending people onto lands that will never be irrigated, either by the Government or private enterprise, and I know of instances where these associations have sent people onto lands on hill-sides, which could not possibly be irrigated.

"I want to stamp these associations as frauds and to warn all homeseekers to avoid them. One of these companies has headquarters at Omaha, and another at Pendleton, Or., but their operations extend over the entire arid West, and they are pretending to give inside information concerning arid lands in every state entitled to benefits under the general reclamation law."
