Thousands of cattle Will be Shipped.

A drive of 400 head of cattle from the Miller & Lux ranch at White Horse, Or., was brought in today by Foreman M. A. Modie and Fred Ramey.

It is said that orders have been given the foremen of all the Miller & Lux ranches to commence a general roundup of cattle with the intention of shipping them to California as rapidly as possible.

FAIR DATE SEPTEMBER 14 TO 20.

At a meeting of the directors of the Fair Association held last Wednesday evening, the date was set for Sept. 14 to 20 inclusive.

At this time it is impossible to give in detail all the particular features of the fair.

The premiums in some instances will be somewhat larger than heretofore given and will be an inducement to our farmers and stockmen to bring in stock and produce for exhibition.

According to the Oregonian of July 21, there is a possibility of a railroad tapping this section, from the east, starting from some point on the Oregon Short Line.

It is believed in Portland that the information possessed by the Hill interests to the effect that the Harriman lines will be extended through Central Oregon.

Two plans have been suggested, either of which might be adopted.

Neither of these plans, by the way, take into consideration the possibility of a simple extension of the Columbia Southern to Bend, leaving further building for the future.

The intimation from Harriman interests that the Oregon Short Line is to be protected in the Northwest railroad building is a strong indication that a line will be projected into Central Oregon from some point on the Oregon Short Line.

The relay race is five times around the track; five horses; change horses each time around; rider to change on a signal and blanket superfluous saddle cloth with latest modes of lots. Entrance fee ten per cent of purse. Money in races to be divided as follows: First money 70 per cent, second money 30 per cent. The Association reserves the right to change any of the above races in the event of their not filling, also to postpone any and all of the program on account of inclement weather.
