HON. CHAMP CLARK TALKS POLITICS.

Missouri Congressman Says Hearst is Strong Presidential Timber.

"W. R. Hearst would be the strongest candidate for election to the Presidency on the Democratic ticket were he nominated," was the unhesitating statement of the Hon. Champ Clark, Congressman from Missouri, who has come to deliver an address at the Gladstone Chateau, says the Portland Journal.

They arrived this morning from Astoria, Or., where Mr. Clark spoke yesterday. He goes from here to Pocatello, Idaho, for another lecture. The day was spent in sight-seeing and part of the forenoon in a reception at the Portland Hotel, where the Congressman was met by a number of citizens.

Before introducing the subject of politics Mr. Clark was asked his view of the Lewis and Clark Fair. "Haven't heard much about it," "I don't see how Missourians can do much objecting to government appropriations, when we got the biggest exhibition appropriation ever given to any state. Undoubtedly the Missouri delegation, with not more than one or two exceptions, will vote for a good sized grant of money for your Fair. Probably, were we able to go back to the beginning and do it all over again we would not give money to any of them. But in 1875 we established the precedent, and it is difficult now to argue against the continuance of the plan. Certainly no event in history has more significance to the western half of this country than the expedition of Lewis and Clark, and it is fitting to celebrate their journey and their services by an exposition of magnitude."

Passing to the national political topics, the Congressman from Pike County, Missouri, gave a brief summary of the situation from a Democratic standpoint, in answer to a question as to Presidential possibilities.

"The men most talked of are Judge Parker of New York, Tom Johnson of Ohio, W. R. Hearst of New York and Arthur Pue Gorman of Maryland. Undoubtedly Mr. Gorman would be the strongest of the lot were it not for the antagonism of the Cleveland fellows, who appear to hate Gorman as heartily as they hate Bryan.

Mr. Hearst is the strongest. He has a very strong hold upon

the laboring people, and estimating probabilities as to national elections something like 3,000,000 votes must be credited to the labor forces of this country. Take the totals in previous elections, allow for the natural increases, and see how potent those 3,000,000 votes would be in determining the outcome of a Presidential election."

Prof. Horace Dillard, wife and three children, of Burns, arrived in the city Saturday and are the guests of St. Hodges and family. They are on their way to Deschutes where they will spend two or three weeks for the benefit of Mr. Dillard's health, which has been very poor of late. Mr. Dillard resided in this city about twelve years ago and is well known by the citizens who resided here at that time. Since moving to Burns he has been engaged a large part of his time as principal of the public school of that city.—Prineville Journal.

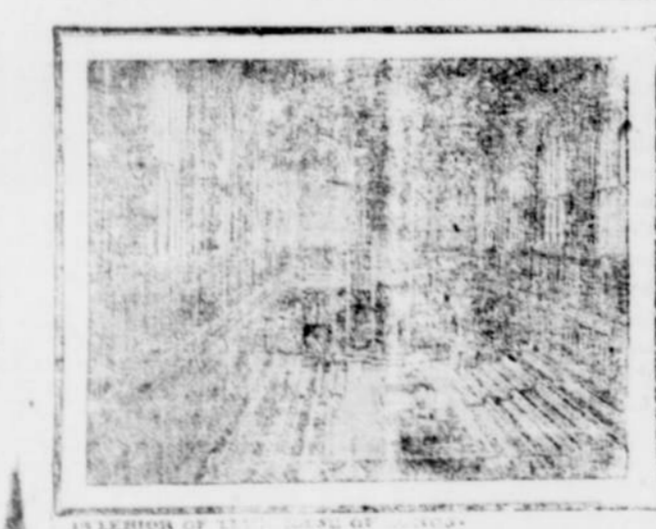
