In Lincoln County the drills had not reached a depth of Soo feet when operations were suspended, and at Vale, in Eastern Oregon, it was thought a few feet more would find the oil, when the men were ordered to drop their tools for the time being. Drillers are now at work on the bank of the Willamette River below St. Johns, with good prospects, and it is probable the work will be prosecuted until the contentions of the oil experts has been verified. Were capital to flow into Oregon for the purpose of drilling wells as it has into Kentucky and Texas, it is likely that more than one oil well would be spouting long ere this. The experts who have looked over the field aver that the quality of Oregon oil is superior to that of the South.


