of an Act entitled "An Act submitting to the Electors of the State of Oregon, at the general election to be held on the first Monday in June, 1904, the pending proposed Constitutional Amendment," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 24th, 1903, I, Geo. E. Chamberlain, Governor of the State of Oregon, do hereby cause the proposed amendment to the Constitution of Oregon, hereinafter set out at length and designated as "Office of State Printer Amendment," to be published for five consecutive weeks in The Times-Herald, a newspaper published in the Ninth Judicial District of the State of Oregon. Done at the Capitol, at Salem, Oregon, the First day of December, 1903. (Signed) GEO. E. CHAMBERLAIN, Governor of the State of Oregon. By the Governor: State of Oregon. F. I. DUNBAR, (L. S.) SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

Resolved by the Senate, the House concurring: That the following article, as an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oregon, be proposed and referred to the next legislative assembly, and if the same be concurred in by a majority of all the members elected to each House thereof, and shall afterwards be ratified by a majority of the electors of the state, then the same shall be a part of the Constitution of the State of Oregon:

Article 1 That Article XII, Section 1, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, be and the same is hereby abrogated, and in lieu thereof shall be inserted the following: The legislative assembly of the State of Oregon is hereby empowered to provide by law for the election of a State Printer, to provide for his compensation, and to prescribe his powers and duties.

J P Withers, Harney, horses, combined TIP on left shoulder; cattle, half circle cross on either hip; earmarks, upperbit in right ear, underbit in left.

Martin Brock, Burns, cattle, double dot horn zonal bar on either hip; earmarks, upperbit in right ear, swallow fork in left, wattle on right jaw; also some branded circle 8 on right side of neck; all animals deboned.

O L Shingledecker, Burns, horses, 5 on left shoulder; cattle, 5 on right side and hip; ear marks, crop off right ear, crop and under half crop off left.

Fred Donsteth, Burns, horses, FD on the left shoulder; cattle, FD on left side; earmark, under half crop in each ear.

R J Williams, Riley, horses, CB on the left shoulder; cattle, CB on left hip; earmarks, crop off left ear, neck on left hip; earmarks, upper slope on each ear, wattle on chin and bell collar.

Sylvester Smith, Narrows, horses, H S on right leg; cattle, V bar, earmark, under half crop and short over slope in each ear jughandle and dewlap.

P G Smith, Burns, horses, quarter circle 8 on right hind leg and left shoulder; cattle, quarter circle 8 on either hip; earmarks, crop off right ear, split in under side of left, two dewlaps.

A E Young, Burns, horses, Y on left leg and left shoulder; cattle, neck on left hip; earmarks, right ear dropped down, wattle cut along towards head on left side, left ear on left side of neck; all animals deboned.

C P Rutherford, Burns, cattle, bar 2 on left side; earmarks, under half crop right ear; horses bar 2 on left shoulder.

Michael Moylan, horses, 35 on left side; cattle 25 on left hip; mark, right ear with fish hook, left dropped down, jughandle on brislet.

Thos Wingfield, Burns, horses, W (chaining) on left shoulder; cattle, same on left side; mark, crop off left ear, short over slope in right ear.

John Craddock, Stiles, horses, S S on the left shoulder; cattle, S S on right side; mark, crop off right ear, swallow fork in left, dewlap on brislet.

W E Smith, Burns, cattle, XI on right side; mark, split in right ear, wattle on nose.

G Hunsper, Burns, cattle, actors on right side; mark, crop and split in each ear.

Simon Lewis, Burns, cattle, SL on right side, mark, crop and underbit in left ear, crop and under half crop off right.

T G Kries, Burns, cattle, quarter circle 8 on left hip; marks, crop off left ear, hole in right.

John Witzel, Burns, horses, W bar on right left shoulder; cattle, neck on left hip; mark, split in each ear, wattle under chin.

J M McKeeney, Burns, horses, reverse L on left side; cattle, same on left side; metal tag in each ear with full name and address.

Varion Ross, horses, LP on right side; cattle, LP on right hip; mark, crop, upperbit and underbit in right ear.

H Elliott, Burns, horses, H4 combined on left side; cattle, H on left side; mark, underbit in right ear, left split in left lower part lopped down against side of head.

C Johnson, Van, horses, SJ on left shoulder; cattle, SJ on left hip; mark, crop and underbit in right ear, underbit in left ear.

C Johnson, Riley, cattle, O bar on left hip; mark, swallow fork in right ear, split in left.

W B Johnson, Burns, cattle, JK combined on left side; mark, crop off right ear, two split and underbit in right ear.

W A Campbell, Narrows, horses, NC combined on left shoulder; cattle, NC on left hip; mark, crop off left ear, underbit in right ear.

John Hipman, Burns, horses, OJ on left left shoulder; cattle, OJ on right side; mark, split in left ear, two underbits in right.

Sam King, Burns, cattle, S on left hip; mark, crop and underbit in each ear, wattle on left jaw.

J P Dickenson, Narrows, horses, anvil on left side; cattle, bar through diamond on the left shoulder; mark, underbit in each ear; some branded on left side and hip.

Rose Rita, Narrows, horses, R bar on left side; cattle, same on left hip or side; mark, underbit in left ear, dewlap on brislet.

A Egli, Egli, horses, E on left side; cattle, E on right hip; mark, upper half crop off right ear; hip; mark, under half crop in right ear.
