#### Precinct Supervisors Abolished.

At the recent term of county court it was decided to abolish the precinct road supervisors, also the office of road master and create instead two road districts in the county with one supervisor for each district. The line was established running east and west at Harney lake with the exception of a jog of one township and part of another which comes north and takes Lawen in the south district. The county board considers the best plan for road work and has appointed competent men to supervise.
