When Land is Taxable

Many people who have made proof on either timber claims or homesteads are naturally interested to know when their lands become taxable says the Asst. Land Tidings.

First, that when proofs are made and final receipts are issued by the district land officers, the fact is reported to the assessor of the county in which the land is situated; second, that the land becomes taxable the first day of March following the issuance of such receipt. For instance: All lands for which final receipts have been issued prior to March 1, 1903 are taxable, and will be assessed for taxes for the year 1904, but these taxes are not due until 1905.

The issuance of a patent by the general land office has nothing to do with the land, that is, all land which was proved up under the timber and stone act, and which was unimproved is assessed at \$3 per acre.

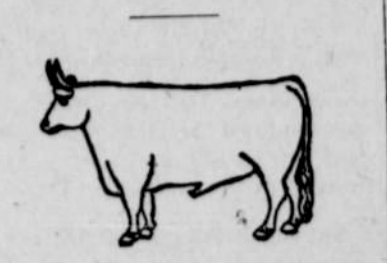
