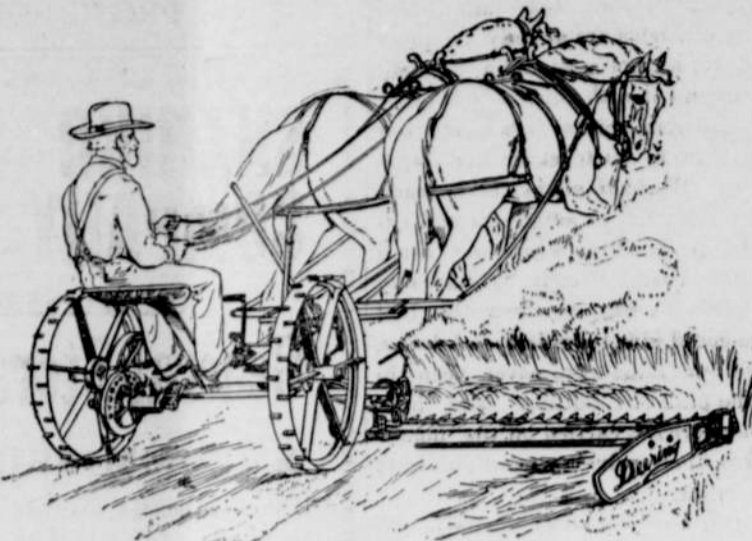
- Burns precinct about 30,000 feet more or less

That is to say the lumber is to be sound and suitable for the purpose for which it is ordered, and the court will also at the same time consider bids to supply the county with 50 kegs of 60 penny spikes to be delivered.
