"An Indian would not miss a feast any more than an Irishman would a wake. I do not know of any local Indians arranging to attend. They do not require passes from the superintendent and may leave for the Nez Perce camp when they feel like it.

"The position of chief nowadays is merely an honorary title. The government recognizes in but a small way the power of the head tribesman.

"Other tribes of the northwest are cut up as badly as the Nez Perces. At Pasco a dozen Indians eke out a miserable existence.
