STABBING AFFRAY AT THE NARROWS.

Scott Catterson Wounded Four Times By Richard Haines Last Night.

A serious cutting affray occurred at Narrows last night in which Scott Catterson was quite seriously, if not fatally wounded by Richard Haines.

The two men got into an altercation in a saloon and Haines cut Catterson four times wounding him twice in the face, one slash across the left hip and a penetrating stab wound in the upper left abdomen.

There was a dance at Narrows last night and it was first reported that Haines had stabbed Catterson while the two were en route from the saloon to the dance hall, but Dr. Marsden states the cutting took place in the saloon.

It is hoped the wounded man will recover, although grave fears are expressed on account of the seriousness of the wound in the abdomen.

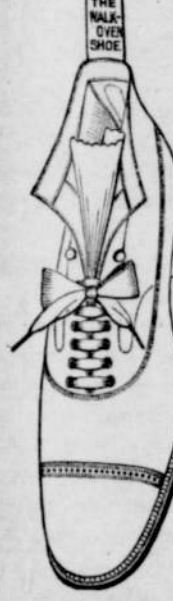
