CENTENNIAL NOTES.

"Hit the Trail" is to be the slogan of the Pacific Northwest in connection with the Lewis and Clark Centennial.

Douglas County, Oregon, has applied for exhibit space at the Lewis and Clark Centennial.

It is estimated that the attendance at the Lewis and Clark Centennial will be between 1,250,000 and 1,500,000.

The American Inn at the Lewis and Clark Centennial, which will be located on the Exposition grounds, will contain over 600 guest rooms.

The new building for the Lewis and Clark Centennial, made necessary by the demands for exhibit space, will contain 90,000 feet of floor space.

A Cuban exhibit from St. Louis is on its way to Portland, where the contents will be exhibited at the Lewis and Clark Centennial.

It is probable that the Riverside, Cal., County Irrigation display at St. Louis will be transferred and supplemented for the Lewis and Clark Exposition.

A Commercial Club has been organized at Albany, Oregon, to exploit Albany and Linn county. The club will have charge of Linn county's exhibit at the Lewis and Clark Exposition.

The Topeka commercial club, of Dighton, Kansas, recently adopted resolutions congratulating the people of Portland on the Lewis and Clark Exposition, and favoring participation on a large scale by the people of Kansas.

The Great Falls, Mont., commercial club is planning a fete to last several days, including the Fourth of July next, to celebrate the Lewis and Clark Exposition. The Lewis and Clark party spent the fourth in 1805 near Great Falls.

The project of a camping ground to be located on the hills behind the Lewis and Clark Exposition is being agitated. Those favoring the project, argue that farmers and ranchers will want to drive to Portland during the Fair and camp out, and that Eastern people will enjoy the novelty of a few days of tent life.

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TO FIGHT FOR HOME RANGE

STOCKMEN OF GRANT COUNTY ARE BANDING TOGETHER.

Organizations Formed to Resist Outside Sheep Next Spring--"Home Grass For Home Sheep."

A special to the Telegram from Canyon City says: Two elements will figure to a greater extent than ever before in Grant County range situation next Spring, and their presence in exaggerated form is leading the stockraiser of the northern part of the county to take early measures to protect themselves against the annual incursion of outside sheep.

The fact that the need for self-preservation is greater than ever before, in addition to the perennial feeling of hostility toward the outside sheepmen, has led Northern Grant Stockraisers to begin early to prepare to repel the 1905 invasion.

A meeting was held yesterday at Hamilton, where the situation was pretty thoroughly gone over by the growers of that section. The meeting was attended also by several cattlemen from Long Creek section, while all the small valleys within 20 miles of this place contributed delegates.

Opposition to the outsider for many years has been largely individual, or at least confined to small communities. In 1902 incipient effort began to get organized resistance together.

"Home grass for home sheep," was the ancient slogan which held first place at the Hamilton meeting yesterday. Passions of settlers rose at the memory of alleged depredations by outside sheep on their farms, and of occasions when they drove their holdings out to neighboring range in Springtime, only to find what they considered legitimate pasture devastated by flocks from Morrow, Gilliam or Umatilla County.

A formal organization has been effected at Long Creek and Hamilton. Similar organization is expected at Monument.

A band of 436 head of cattle were driven through town Friday. They were owned by Henry Trowbridge and John Laycock and were being driven to Ize, where they will be kept for the winter. They were a good lot and looked in exceptionally good shape.
