## Found a Human Skeleton.

Ted Hayes and his men found the skeleton of a human being last Wednesday while excayating for a reservoir and building a dam on one of his ranches near Lawen.

The position of the bones would indicate that it had been a grave, although no trace could be found of any clothing or a coffin. It also appeared as though the body had been placed with the head toward the east, although the bones had been somewhat disturbed by the plow. Where the skeleton was found it was fully six feet from the
