### TOO MANY AMENDMENTS.

Whatever the outcome of the election may otherwise be, this matter of proposed amendments to the constitution should be taken up and given serious consideration, says the Portland Evening Telegram. In addition to an enormous number of candidates, the voters are called upon to vote on eleven different questions of proposed laws, amendments to the constitution and referendum petitions, the title to none of which is stated with a definiteness that makes perfectly clear its meaning.

That all the people could have voted intelligently on these questions it is ridiculous to assume. That many intelligent citizens, who flatter themselves that they always are completely abreast of the times, failed to weigh all of these matters is entirely likely. Indeed, it may be said, it almost required a specialist to reach clearly definite conclusions on the merits of all of these questions presented to the general consideration of the voters.

It is quite evident from this election that: First, the title to every one of these proposed amendments or petitions should be made so definite that no one will be left in doubt as to what they really propose; second, that there should be some definite limitations to the number of questions submitted so that all people may be able to vote upon them with becoming intelligence.—Argus.

### LAND RESTORED TO ENTRY

### SEVERAL IRRIGATION SCHEMES ARE FINALLY ABANDONED.

Quite an amount in the Burns Land District will be subject to entry under various land laws.

The Oregonian says: As private parties in Oregon are becoming interested in irrigation lands withdrawn under the following projects, and as lack of funds will for some years prevent development by the Government, it is deemed inadvisable to obstruct private enterprise by continuing withdrawal, and the Secretary of the Interior has therefore restored the following lands to settlement to become subject to entry 90 days after notice.

- Malheur project—About 534,120 acres, lying in townships 13 to 20 south, ranges 41 to 47 east.
- Chewaucan project—Township 31 south, range 18 east; township 32, ranges 17, 18, 19; township 33, ranges 17 and 19; township 33, range 18; township 34, ranges 19 and 20.
- Owyhee project—Townships 21 and 22, range 45; townships 21, 22 and 23, range 46.
- Silver Lake project—Townships 29 and 29, ranges 14, 15, 16, and 17; township 28, ranges 13 and 14; township 28, range 15; township 28, range 16; township 29, ranges 12, 13 and 14; township 29, range 15; township 29, range 16.
- Ana River project—Township 29, ranges 17 and 18; township 30, range 16; township 30, range 17; township 30, range 18; township 31, range 17.

### LUT IN APPROPRIATION MENACES IRRIGATION PROJECTS.

Portland Board of Trade Takes Initiative  
And Seeks out Circumstances To Enlist  
All Arid Western States.

The Telegram says: The initiative in an effort to enlist all the arid Western States in a united fight against the reduction of the Government appropriation for the purpose of gauging streams and determining water supplies, has been taken by the local Board of Trade. Circular letters have been sent to every commercial organization in Oregon, urging prompt action in the matter and the commercial organizations of other states interested will be communicated with. Letters have already been sent to Oregon's representatives in Congress, and it is expected that the representatives of all other Western States will be asked to join forces and seek to have the reduced appropriation restored to the original figure, that the states affected by the appropriation may not be forced to suffer from the lack of funds to carry on this important work.

The states and territories affected by this appropriation are Oregon, Washington, California, Nevada, Montana, Idaho, Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, Texas, the Dakota, Arizona and New Mexico. An effort will be made to have all these states unite in one determined fight to have the original appropriation restored in the Senate.

Should the reduction go through as recommended, Oregon would be most seriously affected, it is said, by officials of the Board of Trade, as the \$250,000 contingent appropriation of the state would not be available unless an equal amount is forthcoming from the Government. The state appropriation was made contingent upon a Government appropriation of equal amount and unless that can be secured, not a cent of state money can be used. The result would be that the state would be left without a dollar for this most important work.


