MORE RAILROAD ACTIVITY.

It is reported here that all the available engineers in the employ of the Harriman lines in Idaho have been transferred to the central Oregon line of survey and now several crews are working between here and Vale.

Several of the head men have been in this city the past week conferring with Chief Engineer Waggoner, but they are giving out nothing for publication. However, everything indicates the immediate construction of the line across the state as soon as spring opens. We find that very little dependence can be placed in the general newspaper reports as to what is or will be done in the railroad building line through this big country and that reports of subordinates are not to be relied upon. Those who are in a position to know are not talking, so nothing really definite can be said. The most favorable indication is the fact that the survey is being pushed as rapidly as possible and certainly means business.

No other section of the west offers a more promising field for development at this time than Harney county with her millions of acres of fertile vacant land and the further fact of its productivity as shown by the wonderful crops of the past few years.

In view of such activity upon the part of the railroad people and the further evidence of immediate settlement of this section, it behooves the business men of Burns to get together often and discuss the future and lay plans for an active campaign to better conditions and prepare for the change.

BUYS CITY BONDS.

The city fathers decided some time ago to issue bonds to cover the former bonded indebtedness of Burns and the same was advertised in some eastern papers asking for bids for the refunding bond issue of \$4000.

The bid of the First National Bank of Burns was the best received and the matter was closed at a meeting Wednesday. The local institution bid the bonds at par with six per cent interest and a cash premium of \$25. The city is given the privilege of taking up the bonds at any time.

This shows the entire confidence of local people in our future and a commendable spirit upon the part of the First National in taking an interest in its home town.
