ALL OPPOSED TO LEASING.

Dr. W. L. Marsden has been over the county quite extensively the past week or ten days, making a trip to the Buck creek section and later going to the extreme southern portion.

BILLS THAT INTEREST STOCKMEN.

In addition to the sheep grazing bill prepared by the Oregon Woolgrowers Association in this city to be presented to the session of the legislature.

Whether the Hart bill will be acted upon independently, or whether the committee in charge of the Woolgrowers' will seek to merge its best features into their bill is not known.

However it is believed that an understanding will be reached by which the Hart bill will give away to the general bill prepared in this city, and now about ready for presentation.

A Salem correspondent says of the Hart bill, which has been introduced in the senate.

Grazing of sheep owned by non-residents of Oregon on public or state lands of this state is declared to be within the regulation of the police power of the state and subject to the control of the legislature by senate bill 24, prepared by Senator Hart of Baker County.

Non-resident owners of sheep are required to secure licenses from county stock inspectors before they can graze on the public ranges of Oregon, and if they attempt to graze their sheep without a license the owners are liable to a fine of from \$100 to \$500, or imprisonment in the county jail from one to six months, or both.

Application for licenses must be made to the stock inspector of the county where the range is sought. The application must state the number of sheep to be grazed, their brands and whether they are healthy or diseased.

When diseased sheep belonging to a non-resident are found on a public range the sheep are to be returned to the state they came from at the expense of the owner, and such an owner is liable to be fined from \$500 to \$5,000 for sending diseased sheep into this state.

The county stock inspectors are charged with the duty of inspecting all foreign sheep for which range in this state is desired, to ascertain whether they are healthy or not before issuing grazing licenses.—East Oregonian.

TWO LAND DEALS.

Martin Bros., among the first settlers of the Harney County, sold their farm, and all or part of their stock to P. M. Cheney this week. We understand the consideration in the neighborhood of \$200,000, the exact amount not being given out.

Chris Berg and Chas. Kaiser have purchased the Joe Tupker place just a short distance from this city consideration \$5,000. The new owners propose to go into the butchering business and make the ranch headquarters where they will feed and put stock in shape for the block.

DO WE WANT A CHANGE?

The Times-Herald is in receipt of a letter from Representative King stating two new bills had been introduced in the house, one making the assessor tax collector and the other making the treasurer tax collector instead of the sheriff.

The Times-Herald knows nothing of the merits of either bill but does not see wherein they will be an improvement over the present method of handling taxes. The treasurers of the various counties in Oregon have very little to do under the present law but draw their salaries, so it might be a good plan to place the collection of taxes in their hands without raising the salary, thus saving some.
