Can it be that the Reclamation Service is going to use the same tactics in Klamath that caused the people of Malheur county to protest and the final abandonment of the project? A little more of such work will certainly be sufficient to show the people of the West that the money derived from the public lands is being used to pay high salaried, empty-headed officials and instead of our arid lands being reclaimed we are being handed a lemon.

The following is a press dispatch under a Klamath date line:

The Klamath Water Users' Association has been notified that the board of engineers which visited the Klamath project October last has arrived at the conclusion that it would be necessary to leave out of the Klamath River project the bottom of the Lower Klamath Lake, an area of approximately 46,000 acres. This land is to be omitted because of excessive cost of reclamation, and because the engineers deem it advisable that the agricultural value of lands of this character be determined before large sums are expended in its reclamation. The original area included in the Klamath River project was 236,402 acres, but leaving off Lower Klamath Lake reduces the total area to \$190,000 acres.

The board of engineers, through Supervising Engineer D. C. Henry, have also given the Water Users' Association the information that, owing to labor conditions and an advance in the cost of materials, the work done up to this time has cost 35 per cent more than the estimated cost. The board goes still further and states that the cost of reclaiming Klamath lands will be not less than \$25 per acre, and may reach \$30, not including the cost of maintenance. The latter cost, however, is very small.

But ever \$30 an acre is nearly double the original estimate of \$18. The lands of Klamath County will stand the \$30 an acre tax if it is necessary, and few will register a complaint, but when it comes to omitting portions of the project because the engineers do not know whether the land will be productive, Klamath County people might suggest that the Reclamation Service employ a more competent corps of soil experts.

Hereafter long distance telephone connections will be made direct with Baker City instead of Sumpter as it has been formerly. This will greatly facilitate matters here and render the service much better than it has been.
