The following words from Clarence E. Edwards, chief of the publicity bureau of the California Promotion Committee, before the Colusa county Chamber of Commerce at Woodland, are well worth serious attention, as there is a whole lot of truth in them.

"It is one of the rare things of life to have silent, unostentatious work appreciated and commended. It is not only the work of the Chamber of Commerce that counts, but there is another factor in the upbuilding of a community that is a mighty power, but which, as a rule, is derided and almost scorned. I mean the local newspaper, and nothing is as little appreciated. There never was a newspaper, no matter how insignificant that did not do more for its community than the community did for the newspaper.

It is not only in the matter of giving news to the home people that the local newspaper benefits a community.

Every issue carries out to the world the message of progress of the community. I never knew a man who contented a change of location that did not send for the newspaper of the new place. He does not merely read the news contained therein, but examines the advertisements to see what kind of a business community it is. He reads all the ideas that are between the lines as well as those plain to be seen. I want to repeat here, and if possible to emphasize it, that there is no better medium for exploiting the resources of a country than a county newspaper, and you will do well to recognize this fact and see to it that your papers are so well cared for that they will constantly strive to show the world what a fine community they do business in."

Binger Hermann, former commissioner of the general land office, is now on trial at Washington on a charge of mutilating government records.
