You see, when grandfather began searching for me he first found the names of my foster-parents on the register and then found that we had moved to Burns, Or. My aunt, Mrs. May Porter, knew a young boy in that place named Guy Shaffer, so Grandpa wrote to him asking about us, and as luck would have it, he had been our milk boy and he sent back word that we had gone to Colfax, Wash. Then Grandpa wrote to the postmaster there and traced us to Seattle, and by the postmasters of other places where we had lived to Phoenix, Ariz., and so I learned that my parents are alive, and here I am with them safe and and happy. I have sung a good bit and people like my voice, and my greatest ambition now is to secure a musical education, and if I do I will just the happiest girl alive.

GETTING CLOSE TO NATURE

MULT FIGHT TO HOLD OWN

GOV. CHAMBERLAIN SAYS OREGON NEEDS TO BE VIGILANT.

Chief Executive Talks to The Telegram After His Return From a Trip Down the Mississippi With the President.

Governor George E. Chamberlain returned yesterday from his trip down the Mississippi River with President Roosevelt and a dozen or more governors from other states. Governor Chamberlain says he learned one thing from his trip, and that was that Oregon should be represented at these conventions in order that the West be not ignored by the East, and the Governor had practical demonstration of the necessity of fighting for the Coast in discussing appropriations for the improvement of waterways with his fellow Governors.

Politically, Governor Chamberlain says that he found the sentiment in the South was strong for Byran, but with Byran eliminated, the Southerners want Folk. "They told me" said the Governor to the Telegram, "that party lines are being swept away, and now people want men who do things, such as Roosevelt has done for the Republicans and as Folk has done for the Democrats. Roosevelt is making himself strong in the South, and I found a number of Southern Democrats who said they would like to have opportunity to vote for him for President."

"I had several conversations with President Roosevelt while on the trip. When I was presented to him first he greeted me warmly and said he knew all about me, as he and I have been fighting the same battles and I have been supporting the administration policy. In his speeches while discussing improvement of the Mississippi, he would turn to me and say, "Governor Chamberlain, I will speak of the Columbia River later," thus bringing Oregon and our river to the attention of the vast crowds which assembled to hear him speak.

"During his Memphis speech the President kept his promise of speaking of the Columbia River, and he gave it a great deal of prominence in his address, urging its improvement equally with that of the Mississippi. While we were at Memphis I also delivered a speech looking to the interest of our section of the country.

"Those people in the East, however, imagine that the East is the entire country, and President Roosevelt undertook to enlighten them on the subject in speaking of transferring the Navy from the Atlantic to the Pacific. The President declared that his friends of the East protested against the transfer, but Mr. Roosevelt pointed out that the Pacific Coast was home waters just as much as the Atlantic was home waters.

"While we were traveling down the Mississippi a resolution was introduced recommending a convention in Washington for the conversation of the natural resources of the Nation. I had the motion at the request of Mr. Pinchot, which of course came from the President, but this precipitated such discussion that it was finally withdrawn. The discussion developed one feature plainly, however, and that was the East is inclined to consider itself the greater part of the Nation. They expatiated on their miles of seacoast and their miles of navigable water, and I had to show them that the Pacific Coast had far more seacoast than they have and that we have as many miles of navigable rivers as they.
