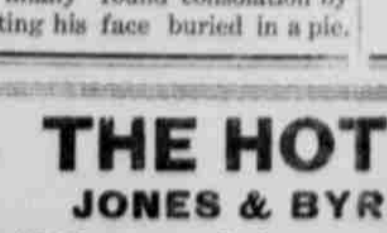

complete appropriation of the water, it must be conceded that it is one of the first steps in making an appropriation of water under our code, and is prima facie evidence of an appropriation in fact and in good faith, and it appears to me to be incumbent on the claimant to show that the waters claimed to have been appropriated are not, and have never been, "applied to a beneficial use."

"And yet the water contentions in reference to Silvies River, as admitted by Mr. Hanley, are far from permanent settlement as to their "distributions," he admitted that "litigation was expected," as stated in the testimony (see page 30), and it is also true that several suits are now pending, and there is impending litigation over this question.
