Chamberlain three years ago and remained until Jan. 1907, having been defeated in the election two years ago for the place. He then entered the law firm of Chamberlain, Thomas & Hailey. Judge had been in poor health for the past year. He was a native son, 40 years old and leaves a wife and two daughters.

The Oregonian, in a recent article, speaking of the serious illness of Judge Hailey, said: "The judge has always been interested in the welfare of the state. It was largely through his efforts that a number of the large government irrigation projects were put through and he interested himself in the passage of irrigation laws.
