JUDGE HAILEY DEAD.

Judge T. G. Hailey died in Portland last Sunday night. Deceased was an able attorney and one of the best known men in the state. He was appointed to the supreme court bench by Gov. Chamberlain three years ago and remained until Jan. 1907, having been defeated in the election two years ago for the place. He then entered the law firm of Chamberlain, Thomas & Hailey. Judge had been in poor health for the past year. He was a native son, 40 years old and leaves a wife and two daughters.

The Oregonian, in a recent article, speaking of the serious illness of Judge Hailey, said: "The judge has always been interested in the welfare of the state. It was largely through his efforts that a number of the large government irrigation projects were put through and he interested himself in the passage of irrigation laws. Some time ago he delivered a series of lectures over the state on good citizenship."
