County Clerk Mothershead has received from the Secretary of State the form of ballot containing the names of all the presidential electors at the November election. Candidates of five political parties are on the ballot, only the populist ticket being left off. The names are:

Socialist—Peter S. Beck, of Umatilla county; W. T. Grider of Union County; James E. Quirk, of Coos county; F. C. Varner, of Benton county.

Independence—John W. Bennett, of Clackamas county; William R. Lake, of Multnomah county; Michael J. Malley, of Multnomah county; Thomas A. Sweeney, of Multnomah county.

FAIR WEEK CLOSES.

Saturday proved a better day at the fair grounds, although it was not ideal by any means and the cold wind made many teeth chatter. The rate program for the day was very good and the stock parade highly appreciated by the large crowd in attendance.

The Times-Herald was somewhat disappointed in the stock parade, however, as but few horses were really in show condition. Some very fine animals were shown, but when they look like they had fleas, mixed with dirt, old hair and so much belly, one can hardly be expected to admire them particularly. The cry that the premiums do not justify getting stock in show ring condition is a poor one as the premiums offered were larger than are put up by any county fair in the west. The idea that the premium list should be large enough to really pay is very foolish, for such is not the intention of any fair and even the state fair does not make such premiums, nor do exhibitors of stock expect it.

THE RACES.

The first race 1 mile dash for untried saddle horses there were five horses to go to the post. Old Bill by Thompson, Dick by Vickers, Teddy Bear by Mace, Ribbon by Turner, and the Henry Richardson colt. Ribbon took first money with Teddy Bear second.

There were three starters in the trot or pace: Prince of Harney, I. H., and Jimmie. It took three heats to decide the race. I. H. did not act in his usual form, as he had a new driver up who had not handled him this year. He took the first heat, making the half mile in 1:34 with ease, but he had been cutting up just before the start in which he had drawn one front shoe and cut his knee quite badly. He did not go out good in the second heat and Jimmie took it in 1:30. The third heat was also taken by Jimmie in 1:27. Any of the colts could beat the time made, but they seemed to be off their stride. Harney colt acted up again and was a sore disappointment.

The half-mile free for all was also a disappointment, as the Connolly colts went around the track by themselves, leaving the other entry Stein's Mountain Bell at the post. The colts were not started but the riders thought they were, therefore the race was declared off by the judges. This race was pulled off Tuesday and the Stein's Mountain mare led the colts all around the track.

The half-mile gaddle horse race Saturday afternoon was another good race with four entries. Burlington's Brownie took the race with Buck's Flute a close second. The men who entered in this race were not entirely satisfied it was all on the square and it is understood all would like to try conclusions sometime.

The premiums will be rearranged and the secretary prepared to pay off by next Tuesday.

The miserable weather was a serious handicap to the management and was not the financial success desired, however, every obligation of the association will be met and every premium paid in full.

CRIMINAL.

State vs. Geo. S. Miller indicted with Peter Miller—larceny of 2 cows and 2 calves. Tried with the following jurors: W. A. Capus, P. G. Smith, C. B. Ausmus, W. C. Greenlee, Alma Davis, C. J. NO DISEASED SHEEP.

Stock Inspector R. J. McKinnon has just returned from an extended inspection tour of the county and reports that he found no infected stock throughout his rounds. Many thousand head are being grazed on Stein's Mountain and in the forest reserve and it is particularly gratifying that no scab was found in any of the numerous flocks. Mr. McKinnon states that feed is rather short owing to the dry season, yet the flockmasters have respected his quarantine restrictions on a large amount of range where scab had formerly been found.
