more thickly, and the demand is greater, it would return into the national treasury \$6,000,000 to \$10,000,000 a year, lightening by that much the burden of taxation which lies upon the people.

"Wake up, American," says Emerson Hough. But we have got to do more than merely wake up. We have got to sit up and take notice, and then get up and go after congressmen, and especially local legislators, with figures like these and with a profound conviction of the truth—and that every other river is only a Mississippi in miniature, and that development of them is a coming necessity, which if we go at it in the right way, means an immense profit account, and which if we go at it in the wrong way, means an immense tax for us, and unaccountable profits for some private corporation."
