In riding over a 400-acre field of 40-fold wheat last summer I observed only one head of smut. Two years ago one of my men treated a small quantity of seed in the old way in a barrel. I saw him doing it and had him stop. He sowed the seed so treated alongside other seed treated as I have described. The part treated in the barrel was smutty while that treated in the trough was entirely uncontaminated. Last year one of my neighbors sowed seed from the same lot as some of my own. He treated his in a barrel. I treated mine in a trough. His was smutty and mine was not. I could cite almost any number of similar instances.
