

MCKINLEY'S PRISON DAYS OVER.

The Journal says: Horace G. McKinley, the man who after a sensational attempt to escape, pleaded guilty to the charge of conspiracy to defraud the government by acquiring title to public lands, two years ago today, finished his term of sentence in the county jail today and was turned over to the federal authorities.

McKinley, who was implicated in the land fraud deals as a partner of S. A. D. Puter, in the famous 11-7 case, was sentenced to serve two years and pay a fine of \$7500. At 11 o'clock this morning the confessed "looter of public domains" went before the United States court and took the pauper's oath, and was released on his own recognizances notwithstanding the fact that there are yet several indictments pending against him in the federal court.

Henceforth Horace G. McKinley will report at intervals agreed on between himself and the United States officials to the district attorney's office. In an interview this morning, McKinley refused to divulge any of his plans for the future other than that he intends to sail immediately for Borneo, where he said he was going to engage in the teakwood business.

This announcement, however, was not corroborated in his interview with United States District Attorney McCourt this morning. McKinley told McCourt that he intends going to Wisconsin to visit his mother.

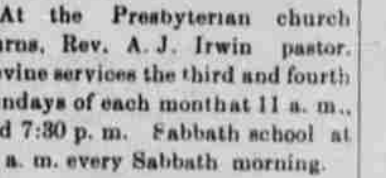
