If Portland's 225,000 population is based in the same manner as the Oregonian credits Burns, Prineville, Vale and Ontario in an article clipped in our last issue that city is considerably smaller than several other coast towns. The article has given each of the Eastern Oregon towns a little more than twice their actual population.

BURNS TO CELEBRATE JULY 4.

A meeting was called at the club rooms Tuesday evening to take up the matter of a celebration at which time a committee consisting of Ben Brown, Geo. Hagey and C. A. Bedell was appointed as an executive board with full power to act and appoint sub-committees. These gentlemen started out with a subscription paper but met with little success at first and have since left the matter rest temporarily. However, they are determined that we have three or four days celebration and say the necessary funds will be raised.

It is the intention to begin Saturday, July 2 and cover three or four days with horse races, baseball, dancing and other sports with a literary program on the 4th. As soon as the scheme is financed the program will be issued. It is assured that Burns will have a big celebration and our neighbors are extended an invitation to join us.

WORK ON MASONIC BUILDING.

Harry C. Smith has drawn some new plans for the proposed Masonic building that meets the approval of the building committee and is now at work on the specifications. As soon as they are completed, submitted and found to be what they desire a contract will be let for the building.

Mr. Smith's plans are for a stone and brick structure two stories high to cover 50x100 feet. The lower floor will be a large store to be occupied by a well known mercantile establishment. The second floor will contain a number of fine office rooms besides the lodge room proper. The first plans were too elaborate and beyond reach of the finances of the lodge but by dispensing with the banquet room the building can be erected with a lodge room 30x50 feet and necessary anti-rooms. It is to cost \$17,000 complete and if the contract is let at once will be ready for occupancy by January 1.

SELLS RANCH FOR \$31,000

One of the big real estate transfers of the week was the sale of Judge Rector's Crow Camp ranch of 1240 acres to Mr. W. H. Robins. The deal was made

through the Inland Empire Realty Co. and the price is said to have been \$31,000.

This tract of land is well situated at the foothills on the eastern side of the valley and has a fine lot of water for irrigation and practically every foot of the land is tillable. The orchard is one of the oldest and best in this section and being close to a high hill on the east has good protection.

Mr. Robins, the purchaser, is from Wallowa county and has returned there for his family and will take immediate possession of the Crow Camp ranch as soon as he can bring the family here. He will farm the land.

Judge Rector is one of the pioneer stockmen of this section and still has a half section of land in the Lawen neighborhood and a large number of cattle. He informs us he will dispose of his stock and take a rest.
