

### Protecting The Garden.

For aphid and leaf hoppers on rose bushes, a Kerosene emulsion or Black Leaf spray should be used. For flea-beetles on tomato plants a spray of arsenate of lead should be used whenever they appear; for aphid, the kerosene or black leaf spray is good.

When flea-beetles are found on sugar beets, the plants should be sprayed at once with arsenate of lead, and treatment should be repeated two or three times at intervals of about two weeks or so.

"If the beds of violets have red spiders or aphid, Black Leaf or kerosene emulsion should be sprayed, to be effective."
