may obtain basis training in the crafts pertaining to soil and crop culture.
The fulfillment of these plans, it is hoped, will draw to Central Oregon what is, after all, the most necessary of all development forces, namely, thousands of new settlers and farmers. It is felt that every advantage should be given these prospective empire builders, however, and so the Central Oregon Development League is laying initial stress upon the more general needs of the section. With everything in the nature of assistance provided, it is realized that the farmers

will come, and that they will give to Oregon an impetus that will send the state leaping ahead in Western history, and which will enable the pioneer territory of the Pacific Northwest to take front rank in the agricultural world.
Much is already being accomplished in preliminary work. In spite of the drawbacks of neglect and carelessness, Central Oregon has proved a leading factor in the wealth of the state. Though irrigation projects of the present day are but abortive forerunners of what is to come, gigantic crops of grain and other farm products have been raised, and transported in the most primitive methods to the railroads leading to tide-water. Dry-farming has been brought to a state of development unequalled elsewhere; and the few watered valleys have yielded returns of surprising profit.
The greatest output of Central Oregon, however, has been livestock. One company alone, in Harney County, has marketed from 20,000 to 30,000 head of cattle annually. The stock has been driven from the ranges to railroad shipping points at Ontario and Shaniko, and to Winnemucca, across the Idaho state line. Aside from the output of this concern, hundreds of individual stockraisers have sent their prime cattle, sheep and horses to shipping points beyond the range wilderness.

Perhaps the most notable aid so far given Central Oregon by Portland citizens and business men has been in connection with the livestock trade. Individual stockraisers often lack funds with which to purchase stock for their ranges. Realizing that financial assistance extended these men is actual aid in the development of the business of Central Oregon, the Portland Cattle loan Company has become a worthy example of constructive business enterprise. This concern loans the stock-breeder money with which to purchase cattle for his range, and the farmer to buy hogs, charging but a low rate of interest, and waiting until the stock is marketed before asking repayment. Though the financial profits of the company are small, the development of the small range into a large one, and the increase of business, makes the

view thoroughly worth while from all plan points.
Many other such enterprises, involving financial aid coupled with sound business methods, can be developed in connection with the growth of Central Oregon. It is help such as this that is desired from Portland's business men by the Central Oregon Development League; and it was with the view to make such assistance the more readily available that many of the tentative plans were promulgated at the October meeting of that body. Those who attended the convention at Burns were unusually impressed with the resources of the country, and became enthusiastic boosters for the region.
The gateway to Central Oregon is the Deschutes River, which empties into the Columbia a few miles above The Dalles. Up the canyon of this stream for a distance of 140 miles, branches of the Hill and Harriman roads climb the water grade to the prairies in the interior of the state. From these lines branches will extend to all sections of the interior empire, while a road crossing the state transversely from east to west will intersect these lines in Harney County.

Not only does the Deschutes furnish the means of ready access to the region described above, but its steady flow throughout the year will furnish untold electric energy for power and lighting in the towns and communities already springing into life in this land of promise. The Deschutes, in its mad rush to the Columbia, has more latent power than the combined American and Canadian falls of Niagara. The construction of suitable hydro-electric generating stations, together with the stretching of transmission lines, will turn Central Oregon into a second South-eastern Washington, the power lines of which furnish the isolated ranchers with light for their homes, horsepower for their farming machinery, and ready communication with all other points of the county.
Central Oregon, however, is destined to outdistance in every way the similar territory in the neighboring state. Washington's growth in fact, is pointed to as but a sample of what the future has in store for Oregon. And it is to bring to early completion this noble destiny that the Central Oregon Development League is now devoting its efforts.
