at the present time, which so far as I can learn, and I have taken considerable pains to post myself, are from twenty-five to thirty per cent lower than a year ago, or even last spring.

I have not been able to dispose of but very few of the horses I purchased in Harney and Grant Counties last spring, and expect to have to winter them and try to dispose of them on the early spring market. To winter and move these horses will cost me at least from \$20.00 to \$25.00 each, even at the present low price for hay, in which event I will never get even on the purchase of the stock considering the liberal prices I paid in Harney and Grant Counties.

I am having these few lines published in your county papers so you may have a chance to post yourselves in regard to the present market prices and be in shape to know when I may make you an offer for your stock you will not think that I am not making you a fair offer and in order that you may not be governed by the high market in the past.

You may ask what is causing the market to decline. I will say and be candid about it, that horses and mules have been so high in the past that steam and electric power have taken the place of thousands of horses in every large city and are found

much cheaper. With electric trucks in the cities and traction engines in the country for plowing and harvesting I do not see anything that will have a tendency to bring the price up in the near future.

Now, these few lines are not intended to deceive you and get your stock under price, but so you may be posted and know when you are offered a fair market price and not miss a sale.
