

**LATEST DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE NOTES**  
(From Our Portland Correspondent)

All Oregon seems to be in a unit in the desire for a suitable appropriation by the Legislature to make a good showing at the two California expositions celebrating the opening of the Panama Canal. The Solons gathered at Salem were visited the past week by delegations representing about every part of the state.

Commercial bodies and business men generally expressed the belief that Oregon will benefit largely from the expositions and should make a strong showing both at San Francisco and San Diego. The subject is being carefully considered at Salem. Meanwhile plans are being outlined whereby the state will be given suitable exploitation at the California expositions.

The Bureau of Animal Industry suggests the formation of Girls Poultry Clubs and has just issued a bulletin on the subject. This idea may be of use in the Country Life movement in Oregon. It is the plan of the Department to have a poultry expert attend meeting of the clubs and a set of rules is outlined. It is proposed to have an exhibition once a year in connection with county fairs.

The date of the State Fair will be later this year than usual in order to permit larger exhibits by children who will enter the State Industrial Contest. The various counties taking this work up last year are enthusiastic over it and plan to go into it more extensively than ever in 1913. Poultry raising will have a prominent part in the contests.

Oregon delegates to the National Livestock Convention, lately held at Phoenix, Ariz., are anxious that an Oregon Cattle Growers' Association shall be organized to affiliate with that body. It is said many benefits will be realized to Oregon stock growers if this is accomplished. The state's importance in livestock raising will be more generally recognized.

Conferences have been held looking to the arrangement of dates for a "County Life Fortnight" in Portland during the Fall and Winter months when dairy shows, land shows, stock exhibits, gatherings of horticulturists, creamerymen, woolgrowers, poultry and goat raisers, flowerists and similar organizations will be held. In this way it is thought meetings of interest to farmers can be grouped so that events in similar lines can be held simultaneously or following each other, and those interested can attend them all without losing much time from their duties at home.

A strong demonstration has been made in favor of the proposed interstate bridge between Oregon and Washington, crossing the Columbia River at Vancouver. Joint committees from the two state Legislatures went over the site chosen for the structure and looked carefully into the merits of the project. At a later meeting in Portland, attended by citizens of both states, very strong support was aroused for the bridge and it seems likely the plan will be accomplished.

Forest rangers of the Southern Oregon and Northern California reserves will meet in Medford, February, 18-21, where they will discuss problems of their work and listen to addresses by experts.

**Livestock Sanitary Board Needed At Once**

A livestock sanitary board and an immediate campaign for education to teach the farmers of Oregon how to prevent hog cholera from ruining the swine industry of the state, is asked in resolutions sent by the Benton County Growers' Association to the legislature.

At the last meeting of the association, in which 450 farmers were gathered, by unanimous vote the following resolutions, submitted by a committee composed of Dr. Hector Macpherson, R. C. VonLehe, Walter K. Taylor and C. Howard Chapin, were adopted, and a copy sent to the legislative assembly:

"Whereas, the well known disease hog cholera has made its appearance in the Willamette Valley, and has already caused the loss of thousands of dollars worth of hogs, and is likely to spread rapidly unless strenuous measures of prevention are resorted to; and

"Whereas, said disease is preventable and controllable by means of quarantine, vaccination and effective disinfection, being a germ disease carried between farms by dogs, cats, birds, rodents, and above all on the boots and clothing of careless farmers; and

"Whereas, nothing has yet been done to prevent said disease from ruining the hog industry of Oregon, which is a complimentary industry to our growing dairy industry;

"Therefore be it resolved, that the legislative and executive departments of our government be asked to use all possible dispatch in making Senate Bill No. 43, 'A bill for the appointment of a State Livestock Sanitary Board,' operative throughout the state; and

"Be it further resolved, that the said board be set to work immediately upon the hog cholera problem, and that it be given the full power and funds necessary for the eradication of the disease from the state of Oregon.

"Be it further resolved, that said board have prepared for free distribution among the farmers of the state a bulletin giving full particulars regarding the nature, spread, and control of hog cholera.

"Be it further resolved, that the departments of animal husbandry and veterinary science of the Oregon Agricultural College, through the extension and publicity departments of the college, be requested to begin an immediate campaign of education of the nature and prevention of hog cholera; and

"Be it finally resolved, that the rural press throughout the state be requested to extend its hearty co-operation with said department of the Oregon Agricultural College in keeping the matter before the public until every farmer is thoroughly informed on the nature and control of this disease."

**Boy's Corn Club Contests**

Boy's Corn Club Contests that was started a few years ago by Secretary Wilson through the Bureau of Plant Industry of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, have become so successful and popular in the South that the movement has become national in character. A recent circular of the Bureau of Plant Industry is an interesting contribution to the subject.

"The national corn club is an important factor," says the circular, "in directing rural boys to the business of farming as a profitable and noble profession. The boys are needed for the efficiency of the farm and their work and leadership must be had if American agriculture is to keep step with the march of civilization."

In connection with organizing and directing clubs the circular says:

"Every premium offered for contests and also corn-club work should have for its main interest the promotion and encouragement of the regular club work. The premium should represent the greatest need and interest of the club work. Encourage both members and leaders to be progressive and constructive in their work, and it should serve to increase the club members' interest for farm life.

"Club leaders, county superintendents, teachers, and others interested in promoting agricultural and rural-home interests should lose no opportunity to have club exhibits and interests recognized effectively at county, district and State fairs. County farmers' institutes, short courses, and teachers associations are excellent mediums for promoting the club work, and an exhibit of club products, special contests, essays, and general discussions on phases of the work should occupy some place and time during the regular session."
