

LATEST DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE NOTES

(Portland Correspondent)

Invitations have been issued by the Oregon State Immigration Commission to representatives of German speaking colonies and organizations to meet at the Portland Commercial Club May 15, where plans will be discussed for attracting German immigration. Representatives of the churches, the German press, the German farmers' colonies, etc., are asked to attend and it is expected the hearing will develop a practical method of including desirable farmers from North Europe to settle in this state.

Jackson County is one district of the state well organized for industrial school fairs this fall. Interest is high in the movement and the various communities will offer attractive prizes for the best work of the school children. In addition to the County Fair, various school fairs will be held.

Farmers who are interested in growing corn are invited to try seed furnished free by the O. W. R. & N. Co. Twelve pound lots will be given out, being about enough to plant one acre, to all farmers applying for it. This is acclimated seed and C. L. Smith, agriculturist for that line, maintains that Oregon can be made one of the foremost corn states.

The place of meeting of the Oregon State Bankers' association has been changed from Roseburg to Corvallis. The dates are June 15-16. Roseburg's new hotel will not be finished in time, making the change advisable.

Cottage Grove is going to form a cannery association and operate an establishment throughout the fruit and vegetable growing seasons. As is usual, the local Commercial Club is taking the lead in organizing the project.

One and one-third fares for the round trip are offered by the railroads to those who attend the Conference on the Conservation of Human Life at Reed College, Portland, May 9-11. Tickets will be good for return up to May 13.

The State Forestry Department has issued paper drinking cups for distribution among school children, there being printed upon each cup a statement of the importance of preserving the state's timber and avoiding a heavy loss each summer. It is thought in this way the young will be enlisted in the work of forest preservation.

The Oregon State Bankers' Association is conferring with representatives of German colonies who are looking for available tracts of land upon which to colonize 3,500 German farmers. Tracts in different parts of the

state are now being looked over with a view to purchase.

David Starr Jordan, president of Leland Stanford University, has discovered a new variety of fish in Coast streams of this state, naming it "Antherinops Oregonia." It resembles the smelt, but is larger. It has never been properly classified before, being called a variety of smelt.

A Ranchman's Bread.

Ranchman's bread is made as follows, according to the receipt in the camp cookery bulletin issued last year by the Oregon Agricultural College and now out of print.

Mix a lard pail two-thirds full of medium batter of flour and water, adding one tablespoon of sugar. Allow it to stand until the mixture has fermented and then become sour. Pour out about half a cup of the sour dough and add half a teaspoon of salt, a teaspoon of lard and enough flour to make a very soft dough.

Short-Horn Bull, and the other Trans-Continental lines in this territory have signified their intention of donating cups for different breeds. Similar cups given by railroad last year were much admired by the people and highly prized by the winners.

Different Ways of Preserving Eggs.

"Eggs may be preserved for several months by different methods" says Prof. James Dryden of the poultry department of the Oregon Agricultural College. "If put up right in the spring they may be kept till the following fall or winter. They will not be as good, however, as fresh-laid eggs."

"A method that will preserve the original quality of the eggs for an indefinite period has not yet been discovered. By cold storage, eggs are put up in large quantities during the spring season when prices are low, but where it is desired to preserve a small quantity for home use the cold storage method is not practicable."

"Eggs intended for storage should be fresh and clean. March or April eggs will keep better than May or June eggs. The sooner they are put into storage after being laid the better they will keep."

THE LIME METHOD.

Dissolve a pound of lime in five gallons of water. The water should be boiled previously to sterilized it, and then cooled. Stir thoroughly, and let settle. Then pour off the clear liquid into a wooden or earthen jar or tub. Fill with eggs to within an inch of the top of the liquid. This will allow for evaporation. The liquid should not be allowed to get lower than the top of the eggs. When the vessel is filled with eggs, cover it with coarse muslin or factory, over which spread a paste of lime to exclude the air.

THE WATER-GLASS METHOD

"Water-glass (sodium silicate) may be purchased at the drug stores. Use the liquid form and the commercial grade in the proportions of one part water-glass to eight parts water. Use earthen jars or wooden tubs or barrels that are perfectly clean, and store in a clean, cool place. The material used will cost about a cent for each dozen eggs stored."
