

THREE NOTCH ROADS.

Their Curious Title Comes From the Name of George III. In Missouri and some other western states there are roads that are called "three notch roads." They are public highways as distinguished from the roads that lead to a sawmill, a schoolhouse, a church or an isolated farmhouse. A three notch road "goes nowhere." Proceeding along such a road, the traveler is bound, in time, to reach a town.

A HISTORIC BELL.

From the Guerriere to the Constitution, Then to a Mill. Yet such an object is in daily use in a factory at Saylesville, R. I. It is a bell, whose history is a most interesting one.
