New Road Building Equipment for County tors.

Road Master Faulkner took the manager of this paper out the other day to see the new road grader at work and to inspect the equipment that has recently been installed. The spiece work then being done was one t test the fitness of the machinery and it was accomplishing many times more during the afternoon than the old way of grading,

The county court has been casting about to see how. more road work could be accomplished with the money available and i would appear they have accomplished the purpose by securing the new equipment. The new machinery consists of a big Avery tractor, elevating grader, push grader and a ripper or scarifer. This is all arranged to work upon one base and therefore convenient and most compact.

There has been a demand upon the court for more road funds as the usual levy of some \$20 000 was not sufficient to cover as much territory as required, but with this new equipment it is possible to cover five to seven times as much territory as the former way therefore the same levy will give us what would equal \$100,-000 under the system that has been followed.
