NOTICE OF CONTEST

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR
Burns, Oregon, June 28th, 1918.
To Newton Hoover, of Burns, Oregon Contestee:

You are hereby notified that Charles R. Davison who gives Diamond, Oregon, as his post-office address, did on June 28th, 1918, file in this office his duly corroborated application to contest and secure the cancellation of your Homestead Entry Serial No. 08158 made 5-28 1915, for E 1/2 SE 1/4, Section 27, NE 1/4, and the N 1/2 SE 1/4 of Section 34, Township 31 South, Range 33, East, Willamette, Meridian, and as grounds for his contest he alleges that said Newton Hoover has wholly abandoned said entry, that he never established or maintained a residence, or made any improvements thereon, and has absented himself, changed his residence therefrom every since the date of entry; That the entryman alleged absence from said land is not due to his employment in connection with operations in military service rendered in connection with operations in Mexico, or along the borders thereof, or in mobilization camps elsewhere, in the military or naval organizations of the U. S. or the National Guard of the several States or Territories.

You are, therefore, further notified that the said allegations will be taken as confessed, and your said entry will be cancelled without further right to be heard, either before this office or on appeal, if you fail to file in this office within twenty days after the FOURTH publication of this notice, as shown below, your answer, under oath, specifically responding to these allegations of contest, together with due proof that you have served a copy of your answer on the said contestant either in person or by registered mail.

You should state in your answer the name of the post office to which you desire future notices to be sent to you.
