NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO the legal voters of School District No. 1 of Harney County, State of Oregon, that a SCHOOL MEETING of said District will be held at Public School Building, on the 30th day of Nov., 1918, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon to vote on the proposition of levying a special district tax.
